From June 20th to December 8th, the Maison Européenne de la Photographie is pleased to present a new exhibition of its collections at Espace Musées, located in Terminal 2E of Paris-Charles de Gaulle airport.

Located in the heart of Paris' Marais district, the MEP is a museum dedicated to photographic creation in all its forms. The MEP's rich exhibition program showcases the very best in contemporary photography, and also promotes the presentation of its collection by organizing numerous in-house exhibitions in France and abroad.

Representative of the international photographic scene from the 1950s to the present day, the MEP collection comprises over 24,000 photographic works, 800 artists' films, 110 artists' videos and 36,000 printed works.

For this exhibition for the airport public and travellers, the MEP has chosen to present a selection of its collections through the prism of three major themes: Paris, Fashion and Portraiture. These themes from the history of photography allow us to present artists such as Richard Avedon, Valérie Belin, Brassaï, Hiro, William Klein, Sarah Moon, Bettina Rheims, and many others.

The presentation of this collection is the 15th exhibition of Espace Musées, a unique museum concept inaugurated 10 years ago at Paris Airport. It is freely accessible to thousands of travelers and staff in Terminal 2E Hall M, and offers an alternative to duty-free stores to all passengers in the departure lounge.
